Sheriff Buncich gave an explanation in reference to what is going on with the Medicaid Bill. He explained that in September/2015, the Bill was signed, House Bill 1269, and it is designed to take the burden off of the larger counties with the larger jails in this State. He said they have been undergoing millions of dollars of medical costs for the inmates who are confined, and having to put them into the hospital. What this is going to do is mandate us to fill out every individual in our jail, with 30 days or more of incarceration, to register for Medicaid. Sheriff Buncich said they have been backing this for the past several months, it's quite detailed, and we are ready to go on this. He said we are meeting with the Administrators of The Methodist Hospitals to primarily do all of our medical work.

He said they are 6 or 7 months behind right now, and it's going to take some catching up, and members of his staff are professionally trained to perform this task.

Dernulc added, it's a Mandate, it must be done. It's going to save approximately \$750,000 to \$1 million dollars.

Sheriff Buncich said, once this thing gets rolling, the burden is going to go with the hospitals, it's a really good thing.

Bilski said this is something that he sees as saving a lot of money on, and deferring the cost of hospitalization. The cost in that Jail can become astronomical. He said we do have a large percentage of indigent people that don't have any insurance, or health care whatsoever, that is something that had been absorbed by the taxpayers of Lake County.

Attorney Szarmach asked that you do the Civilian Staff Supervisor first, with the revised 144, then the transfer.

Franklin said that she has a problem with that because every other day, the gas rate changes. Bilski said, I understand, if we were to raise it above the Federal standards, then everyone that was reimbursed above... Bilski then said, I agree with Franklin wholeheartedly, we don't know one day to the next what the fuel is going to be, and he thinks everyone here agrees with Franklin, you never know what you are going to pay at the pump. Bilski went on to say, if you raise that above the Federal standards, then each and every employee in Lake County that received that additional amount would have to pay tax on that additional amount, because they would have to show it as income. So we can't do it. We have no choice but to follow the Federal guidelines.

Franklin asked we don't have the choice, but to reduce it?

Bilski said he doesn't think it would be fair to the employees here, if they were to have to carry that 2 1/2 cents as income, and what it would do to the Auditor's Department when we go to file taxes. Bilski said he thinks the amount of money that it would generate would not be as positive as we would like it to be.

Franklin said she is totally against doing it, but she doesn't want it to create any problems for anyone, particularly in her district, as well as, and most of all, our employees.

Attorney Szarmach said, this is the rate that it's going to stay for the year, from the Federal Government, and if you pass a higher rate, whoever is putting a claim would then have to report that on their income tax, the extra dollars that you're getting, and it just complicates things, and will cost you more with your accountant, than it would be worth. Szarmach said, he doesn't see any time soon, that the gas is going to go up. The supply and demand right now, is they are looking at \$10 dollars a barrel of oil, probably gas is going to be about \$1.25.
